Our History:

The New Westminster Homelessness Coalition (NWHC) was formed in 2005 to bring together a range of people and organizations working to address homelessness in New Westminster.

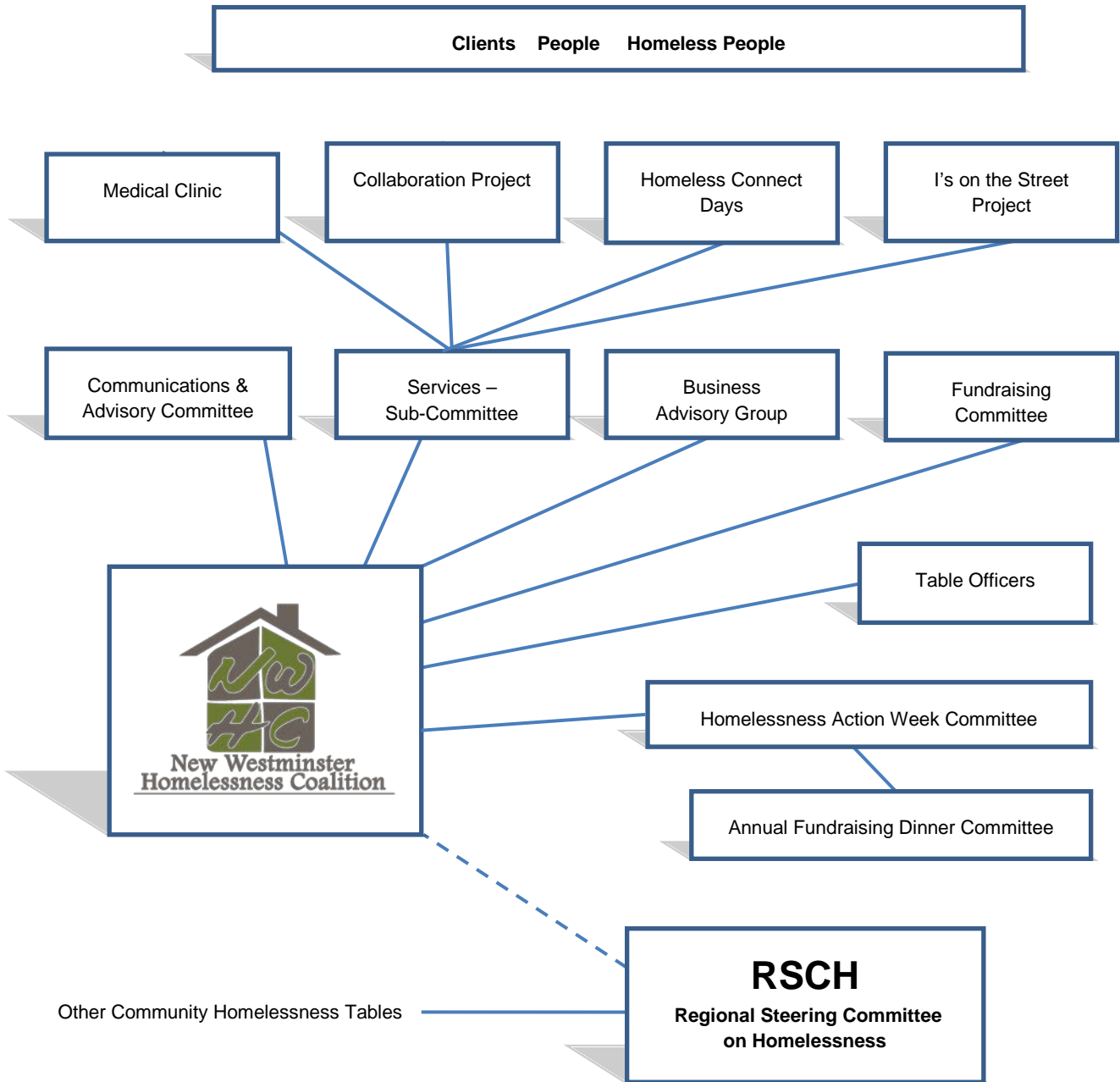
The NWHC works together with the Metro Vancouver Regional Steering Committee on Homelessness, which developed and oversees the implementation of the Regional Homelessness Plan for Greater Vancouver. The Plan has guided the provision of shelter and services in the region since 2000. Together with the Regional Steering Committee, the NWHC has been successful in influencing policy and securing funding for projects that are aimed at reducing homelessness.

The coalition is funded by the City of New Westminster, private donors and also receives some assistance and planning/promotional materials from the Regional Steering Committee on Homelessness.

Our member organizations deliver housing, outreach, food, job training, crisis intervention and youth programs, and witness firsthand the day to day challenges of poverty and homelessness in our city. We continue to work on addressing the needs of the homeless in New Westminster, enabling many people to permanently break the cycle of homelessness.

Last year, we continued to work on developing our action plan to address homeless issues, and began working on specific action items. Sub-committees were formed to develop our organizational framework, and examine and tackle gaps in services.

I's on the Street:

I's On The Street is a unique outreach program operated as a street cleaning business that engages homeless or near homeless people, some with mental illness/addiction into recovery through employment.

It is an award winning, non-profit social enterprise designed to serve as a "stepping stone" to regular employment. Through a collaboration with the Downtown BIA, the City of New Westminister, New Westminister Mental Health and the New Westminister Homelessness Coalition, this program strengthens each year and hopes to expand.

Medical Clinic:

This clinic is a free, walk-in clinic to improve the health and welfare of people who may otherwise be unable to receive treatment.

The program is staffed by a Nurse Practitioner, Public Health Nurse and a case manager from the Stride Program at the Purpose Society who provide basic primary care and a follow up care for our patients that do not have or can't access a Family Physician.

Clinic hours: Fridays 11:00 am – 3:00 pm, first come first serve basis.
